## CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY ORIENTEERING CLUB

### CONSTITUTION:

- 1) The club shall be called "the Cambridge University Orienteering Club".
- 2) The club shall consist of resident members of the University only.
- 3) The club exists to promote the sport of orienteering within the University.

### RULES

- 4) The Officers of the Club shall be: Chairman, Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Junior Treasurer. All officers shall be elected annually by a simple majority of those present and voting at the Annual General Meeting of the Club.
- 5) There shall be held every Easter term a meeting of the Club to be called the Annual General Meeting. Not less than seven clear days notice shall be given of the meeting.
- 6) The Executive Committee of the club shall consist of the Officers of the Club plus three other members of the Club elected at the Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall have power to co-opt additional members.
- 7) The treasurer shall submit audited accounts to the Annual General Meeting for the previous year ending 31st March.
- 8) Teams to represent the club shall be selected by the Selection Committee which shall consist of the Chairman, Secretary and Honorary Junior Treasurer.
- 9) The club members shall be informed of the activities of the club by a minimum of one newsletter per term and by any other means that the Executive Committee may decide.
- 10) The annual subscription of the club shall be fixed by the Executive Committee.
- 11) The constitution and rules of the club shall be altered only by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting either at an Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting called for the purpose. Not less than seven clear days notice of any proposed amendment to the constitution and rules shall be given.
- 12) At the request in writing of not less than six members of the club, the Secretary shall call a General Meeting of the club.
