General Notes on Pre-entries and Weekends

You will also not be entered unless you have actually paid for your entry before the date on which entries are to be POSTED (not the published date for LATEST entries) which is always clearly displayed on the n/board. There is nothing to stop you from entering yourself for events if you want to, don't forget to tell a Cttee member so that you can be included in the number of people requiring transport.
